

Women's Peace Garden:

It was designed with the peace symbol and the woman symbol. Bluestone pavers form a circle with a Y inside to create a peace sign in the grass. The circle joins a + symbol created by the shelter to form the female symbol.

This park was built on the old Newmarket saleyards which closed in the 1980's, after which they were developed into medium density housing. The heritage of the area has been remembered with many of the old peppercorns also the bluestone paths and post and rail fences.

The garden was built in 1986 to commemorate the International Year of Peace. It was designed by a team of women. The plants were chosen to fit with the colours of the Women's Movement — green, purple and white — and to symbolise remembrance — the peace rose, rosemary and olive trees.

Emma Page Campbell is the Lady Mayoress of Melbourne and Patron of the National Council of Women of Victoria. Emma is Patron and Co-Chair of the Lady Mayoress' Committee, a committee of the Lord Mayor's Charitable Foundation, with Co-Chair Councillor Susan Riley. Emma has a long involvement with Artists for Kids Culture, a charity supported by local artists which raises funds to enable arts and cultural opportunities for kids living in the inner city. She has been Judge of the GLOBE GLBTIQ Community Awards since 2014.

Emma is a practising lawyer and manager of the Governance team at ACMI (Australian Centre of the Moving Image) since July 2015. The Governance team's areas of work include: Legal & Governance; Intellectual Property Management; Risk Management; Board Secretariat Strategy/ Interdepartmental - Executive support.

Emma participates in various industry steering committees and working groups in the area of copyright law and law reform. Emma has also worked with the Office of Film and Literature Classification (Classification Board) and the Department of Justice civil law and policy division (Victoria), contributing to legislative changes (federal and state) in the area of classification of audio-visual / film materials and games. While at ACMI, Emma has been a member of the Corporate Legal, Intellectual Property Legal / Production Unit, Licensing & Copyright, Planning & Corporate Governance and now Finance & Governance teams.
